Mary Seacole was a British Jamaican nurse who set up a British hotel.

Mary Seacole

Mary's mother was a healer in Jamaica. She taught Mary many of her skills using traditional Jamaican herbal medicines. Mary used these during the Crimean War and are still used today. For

Florence Nightingale

Florence Nightingale, also known as The Lamp with the Lamp, worked as a nurse during the Crimean War. She a founder of modern day nursing and trained other nurses. She made hospitals cleaner places to stay to stop the spread of illnesses. A lot more patients recovered because of the better care that they received. 1883 she was awarded the Royal Red Cross by Queen Victoria. Today nurses can receive a Florence Nightingale medal for providing good care during war. During the Covid-19 pandemic temporary NHS Nightingale Hospitals were set up International Nurses Day is celebrated every year on 12th May - her birthday
